We were diligent and called before we dug and got the current

underground lines marked. Trenching began. Shovelling happened. Wouldn't you know it, we hit a power line! In our defense though, it was only four inches deep. Did you read that? FOUR inches deep, and in the middle of the camp! We play games and have stuck rods in the ground in that area. No one was hurt and nothing was damaged, both on that day and in all the years that camp has operated. That day we got a call from friends who pray for us every day and we were able to share that story and say, "Thanks." Maybe that's also you, praying for us each and every day. We say THANK YOU.

We saw prayer answered one year when we were getting lots of rain. The program director wanted activities outside, so we prayed that the rain would stop on our property. It did. Someone from town was driving out and they said you could see on the road where the rain stopped and the sun was shining at the camp. Another time, the camp was spared during a major storm and tornado when 100 people crammed into our basement.

We have seen staff transformed, and fundraising happen so that we are debt-free on the new dining hall. We have seen vehicles provided and also enough staff to have camp. Want to hear more answered prayers? Give us a call.

I'd like to challenge you, would you commit to praying for BRBC daily? Praying for unity for the full-time staff. Praying for past, and hopefully current, campers. Praying for past summer staff and current staff. Praying for funds to come in so we can operate and do the upgrades that are needed. Pray for wisdom as we lead.

ave you ever wondered why prayer is an important part of the life of a believer? God already knows what we need, so why does He invite us to pray?

1 Peter 5:7 says, "Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you." Q: How many years have you worked at camp? A: One.

Q: What are you doing right now to stay strong following Jesus? A: Praying and reading my Bible and staying away from bad environments.

Q: What is something you have learned in your time at BRBC? A: Being around people has become easier and I have gained more confidence.

Q: What are some of the challenges you have faced as staff? A: People. I tend to be more introverted, so being around people all the time was challenging. •

As we continue into another year with still much uncertainty, we don't know what the summer will look like at camp. Continue to pray that we can do camp, or if we can't, that the Lord will give us ideas and insight on how to use our facility effectively. •
