A glimpse of the ministry BRBC has in the lives of staff who come and serve here.

Q: Anita, we heard you took
"Caring for the Heart" training. What
is "Caring for the Heart"? A: The CFTH
mission statement is: "We exist to care for
the heart by assisting individuals to identify and resolve emotional and spiritual
issues utilizing wisdom from the Word of
God, trusting in Jesus as Healer, and the
enabling power of the Holy Spirit."

Q: Why did you choose CFTH? A: CFTH came highly recommended to us. We hosted a training session at BRBC in 2018 and saw first-hand how this method of counselling helps people overcome and heal from pain or sin issues. It is not just talking about your past and dragging up all the old memories, nor is it avoiding



sin issues. It is talking with people and hearing their stories and then praying with them and bringing them to Jesus to deal with the pain, and to find freedom.

Q: How will this be valuable to your ministry? A: This is a relational way to walk with people and care about them. We don't have to have all the answers or give the best advice. We pray with them and ask the Spirit to bring healing and clarity. There are times when we are totally at a loss, but God knows what is going on in someone's heart, and He can minister directly to them.

Q: What is the most valuable piece of wisdom you gained? A: I don't have to carry others' burdens on my shoulders. I abide in Jesus and stay connected to the Vine and then I love others by walking with them on their journey. I pray for them. I listen to them and I bring them to Jesus and ask Him to minister to their hearts. I tended to get overwhelmed with all the brokenness in the world and it caused me to be too paralyzed with concern to pray. Now I try to remember that my responsibility is to abide in Jesus and bring all that is heavy on my heart to Him to carry. I wasn't meant to carry that load. He was. •
